The word “God + spell” comes from the Old English god (meaning good) + spell (meaning news). It refers to a special good word from God that sets the world free. It is not a magic “spell” or magic word, but the Word does hold power. And that Word is? Jesus.

The first part of the Bible, commonly called the Old Testament or Hebrew Scriptures, tells about God choosing a people and training them in righteousness. The second part of the Bible, called the New Testament, starts off with four “good news” eyewitness accounts of Christ’s life. They are not biographies of Jesus but rather testimonies by four different people sharing their real-life experiences with their Lord. They each tell the same story, yet differently.
