**FUNDOCY Homework: The Damascus Road**

**Part I: The Lesson**

1. Today we are studying the conversion experience of a man who was originally named Saul. Using a dictionary, define "conversion":

2. As best we know, Saul was born approximately 10 years after Jesus was born. Saul was a strict Pharisee (a kind of Jew who was very attentive to the law and sought to follow the Old Testament laws as closely as possible). Saul was a well-educated man who was also a Roman citizen. As a Roman citizen, Saul had many more rights and privileges than the common person.
3. As a Pharisee, Saul viewed the early Christian movement as a dangerous cult. Why might he have thought Christianity was dangerous?

4. Read Acts 7:58-8:1. This tells of the stoning of a faithful Christian named Stephen. What did Saul think when Stephen was killed?

5. Read Acts 9:1-9.
  - "the Way" refers to Christianity...Saul was on a mission to find and enslave Christians!
  - Where does the light Saul see come from? (see Acts 9:4) \_\_\_\_\_

6. When Saul cried out, "Who are you, Lord?," the voice in the blinding vision said:

  7. When Saul reaches the city, God sends a Christian named Ananias to meet him. Ananias doesn't understand why God would look favorably upon someone like Saul (remember, Saul has done terrible things to Christians!)

  10. Though we don't know *how* or *when* it happened, we know that Saul's name was changed to Paul.
  11. Read Acts 9:26. Did the disciples believe that Paul was *really* a Christian? \_\_\_\_\_

  12. Barnabas, a trusted disciple, helps the others to believe Paul and Paul became a very important man in the early church. He traveled from city to city telling everyone who would listen about Christ. He was eventually killed for his faith.
