From Pastor Eileen...

The Sound of Silence

The angel] said [to Elijah], "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by." Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind, and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake, 12 and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire, and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. —1 Kings 19: 11-12

Sometimes, the noise can be overwhelming. Not only noise that we hear with our ears, but the noise of emotions tumbling in our head, our heart and our gut!

Elijah was experiencing a lot of emotional noise. His prayer was one of despair and discouragement: "the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away."

In the midst of all of this noise, Elijah experiences God in "a sound of sheer silence."

Sometimes, silence is needed to calm the storms within us and to help us recognize God's presence. You may already have some favorite places where you go or things that you do to experience or create the silence you need. I would love to hear about the ways you do that. Please send me an email (esmithlevan@trinityrobesonia.org) or a note or drop in to see me in person to share your story. With your permission, I hope to share those stories to give others ideas to help them find places of silence where they can be open to God's presence.

I'd also like to make you aware of a new space at church where you can find a place of silence.

Our youth have created a **Prayer Room** in the space that was the library. It is located on the lower level, at the foot of the stairs. From the elevator, turn left. It is a simple, quiet space where you can pray or just sit in silence. It is available anytime the church is open. (If you come in during the week, please be sure to let someone in the office know that you are there.)

A beautiful and haunting hymn in our ELW (704) begins with this verse:

When pain of the world surrounds us with darkness and despair, When searching just confounds us with false hopes everywhere, When lives are starved for meaning and destiny is bare, We are called to follow Jesus and let God's healing flow through us.

From Vicar Jaymie...

ow do I sum up two years that changed me so deeply? I suppose I could start here.

I've swooned over Fox Meadows ice cream and Twilight Acres' treats, celebrated my birthday at Shady Maple, and frequented Crave. I got lost in the Duncan Corn Maze and met the Sattazahn cows. I directed traffic for the

Jack Frost Parade and preached over 40 sermons. I experienced the good kind of exhaustion after two rounds of VBS, learned SKYJO on Game Night, wrestled with scripture during Coffee and Conversation and Adult Bible Study, led devotionals for the Food Pantry, and discovered that I can move an Oreo from my forehead to my mouth in less than 10 seconds.

Because this goodbye isn't just about leaving a place. It's about letting go of a rhythm, a routine, and a community that has shaped me. It's about saying farewell to the unexpected gifts. It's about the people

who welcomed me into their homes, who let me pray for them when words were scarce, who showed up again and again to sing, serve, and wrestle with scripture—not for the sake of answers, but for the sake of love.

And it's about the lump in my throat I keep trying to ignore, because there's not enough room in this newsletter to capture the depth of my gratitude—or the breadth of my love—for all of you. When I first said yes to serving as your vicar, I truly didn't know how it would work out. It felt a little wild, driving from New Jersey to Pennsylvania for two years. But it did. And now I have 19,000 miles on my car to prove it.

As I prepare to leave, I'm feeling something like I did when my son moved five hours away to create a beautiful life with his girlfriend—that ache of not knowing exactly when we'll be together again. That quiet grief tucked inside the joy of seeing someone step into the next chapter. It's hard...yet it's holy.

Saying goodbye hurts. But you've taught me something I'll carry wherever I go: that living a joyful, Spirit-led life means being called by Christ and gathering in grace with people who want to draw closer to God. And I've learned that trusting the Spirit doesn't mean having all the answers or avoiding conflict—it means showing up with clear eyes and an open heart, and learning how to love like Jesus, together. Because this is how we heal our broken world and create heaven here on earth.




Do you sew? We will need drawstring backpacks for our school kits. They may be purchased or made out of sturdy cloth, using a pattern from LWR. If you
