From Pastor Eileen...

Singing New Hymns

or Lutherans, music is woven into the fabric of our worship life. This has been so since the time of the Reformation. Martin Luther held music in high esteem. Among the numerous quotes that have been attributed to him is this one: "I place music next to theology and give it the highest praise."



Some of the music in our worship is provided by trained, professional musicians or talented volunteers such as the choir, who spend time weekly preparing for the sabbath day worship. But because our Lutheran roots also value the participation of the worshipping community, hymn singing is a central piece of our worship.

You may (or may not!) know, that the hymns we sing each week aren't simply chosen at random. They are selected to reflect the theological themes of the scriptures we read and the season of the church year. While there are many old favorites, there are also new hymns created by gifted composers. If you are able to read music, singing a new or less familiar hymn may be relatively easy. But if reading music is not one of your skills, you may feel frustrated if you're not able to follow the tune and sing along.

If this describes you, I'd like to offer a suggestion to help you begin getting acquainted with a new hymn. Instead of trying to sing a tune that you don't know, try listening to the people singing around you and pay attention to the words. You may discover some new inspiration, some comfort. some joy or a prayer that expresses what was in your heart but that you couldn't find a way to put into words. And if you listen without trying to manage singing an unfamiliar tune, you may gradually find yourself learning it!

The hymns chosen for worship are meant to help us reflect on God's word, to inspire us and sometimes to give us a different way to pray. So if singing the new ones isn't easy for you, I hope you will try some of these different ways to have them speak to you and help you to worship.


With Gratitude From Vicar Jaymie...





• The Greatest Story: Engage. Surprise. Transform.


