From Pastor Jen...

Dear Trinity Family,

There is a small sticker on my office door that says, "safe space." I post that sign as a reminder to anyone who enters my office that I am actively working to keep a space safe for everyone.

What I realized, however, is that a safe space for me may not be a safe space for everyone else. I know that sometimes my words or physical reac-

tions to things people share may not be the words of support that people need to feel safe. So, the sign on my door is also a reminder to me, that the office itself doesn't create a space of safety, but how I engage with people in this space using my words and actions is what creates a safe space.

I wish I could guarantee safety to all who enter not just my office, but the entire church building. And while a church is a space that we want others to feel safe in, it is us—the people within these walls—that create spaces that are safe. It is our words

and our actions that create space for others to feel vulnerable, to ask questions, to voice opinions, and to know that they will be listened to and cared for.

What does it mean to be part of a community that works together to create a safe space for all of God's children? It means using our ears to listen before we rush to a response, joke, or sly comment. It means honoring others in the space they need to worship. They may want to sit alone some weeks, or they may want to join you where you sit or for a cup of coffee in the social hall. It means that we take the lead from other people rather than decide what we think they need or how we can best care for them.

Part of the holy work we are called to do at Trinity is to create and nurture safe spaces for all of God's children. When we do that together, some folks will feel even more welcome; and at the same time, this may not be the place for everyone. At PPC a few years ago, we talked about being a church that welcomes anyone, but we also acknowledged that we may not be the church for everyone.

Why Do We Do That?

A short series about frequently asked questions about Lutheran worship

Weekly Holy Communion

A dults who have been Lutheran for all—or most—of their life often have memories of a time when Holy Communion was not regularly celebrated on a weekly basis. So why did we change from celebrating Holy Communion once a month, or even once every 3 months, to every Sunday?

From the time of the Reformation, Martin Luther and other reformers taught that weekly communion should be practiced. The biblical witness tells us that early followers of Jesus celebrated the Lord's supper weekly when they gathered for worship on the Sabbath.

But when Lutherans settled in the New World, there were very few ordained pastors within their numbers. This meant that, although the people could gather for weekly worship, there was often no ordained pastor to preside for the sacrament. So Holy Communion would be celebrated on the occasions when an ordained pastor was able to be present. How often that happened would depend on how often the pastor's schedule brought them to a particular worshiping community.

As there began to be more pastors, worshiping communities were able to celebrate Holy Communion more often. But as is often the case, established patterns became traditions. So even when a pastor was regularly present, many Lutheran worshiping communities continued the pattern of celebrating Holy Communion once a month or even less.

In the 20th century, a liturgical renewal movement began. Lutheran congregations began to reclaim the practice of weekly Holy Communion, recognizing its importance in feeding spiritual hunger. In 1997 the ELCA published the document "Use of the Means of Grace" which encouraged all congregations to celebrate weekly communion.

While there are still Lutheran churches where Holy Communion is not celebrated weekly, the great majority of ELCA Lutheran churches have adopted the practice of weekly communion. Some, like Trinity, offer communion at mid-week worship as well, recognizing that this is a gift from God, a reminder that we are loved and forgiven; a reminder we cannot receive too often!

Baptismal Font Restoration

We are pleased to have restored the former baptismal font in the Narthex, now placed near the entrance to the nave. Each time you enter for worship, it serves as a reminder of your own Baptism. Martin Luther wrote that Baptism is God's eternal covenant of grace and not made futile by our stumbles. When troubled, Luther himself would cross himself and proclaim, "Get away from me, I have been baptized." As you enter, feel free to dip your fingers in the water, make the sign of the cross, and renew your Baptism. You can also reflect further on Baptism by reading Luther's words on page 1164 of the Evangelical Lutheran Worship book.

With support from local churches, organizations, individuals, and Helping Harvest, 57 families (197 students) signed up, averaging 33 families and 85 students each week.
