## A Note About the 2026 Proposed Budget

We are preparing for a full-time vicar.

Knowing all of these things, we are in a place of hope for the future as we trust in God's guidance to faithfully use the finances you all have entrusted to this place. This budget helps us continue to nurture and support a vibrant youth and family ministry program. This budget helps us lift future church leaders. This budget allows us to continue inspiring worship, creating space for connections of all ages and helps us to do the work within and beyond the walls of the church.
