From Pastor Eileen...

Gifts for the New Year

Christmas is past, gift boxes and wrapping paper have been discarded (hopefully recycled!), and while some thrifty folk are shopping after-Christmas sales, many more are leaving out sighs of relief that the gift purchasing and gift-giving season is past.

But I would like to challenge you to find the opportunities for gift-giving in the year to come as a way of being a faithful follower of Jesus, using the resources you have been entrusted with to care for God's creation and for our neighbors.

Those resources may come in many shapes and forms. Financial resources are an obvious one, but there may be others that we don't always recognize as valuable.

For example, do you have some time on your hands and a dependable car? Western Berks Shepherding Ministries can always use volunteer drivers to help provide transportation for ambulatory seniors who don't drive to help them get to doctor's appointments or for a trip to the grocery store.

If you're able to do some physical work, Helping Harvest depends on volunteers to do their work feeding people in Berks and Schuylkill counties. In 2024, 2,624 individuals gave over 30,000 volunteer hours to support their mission.

The Conrad Weiser Food Pantry which operates out of our building here at Trinity also depends on the work of volunteers.

Do you have a special place in your heart for the children of our community? Barbara Boland, who serves as the Coordinator of Student Assistance Services for Conrad Weiser Area School District has let us know about some of the needs of Conrad Weiser students. Financial assistance is always appreciated to help with costs for counseling services for students. Recent significant cuts in state funding have made this need even more important. Barbara has also let us know that there is a need for boys and girls coats (new or gently used) in sizes from 5 toddler through adult extra large, as well as socks and underwear in children's and adult sizes.

For more information about how to "gift" your resources in any of these ways, please talk to me! I'll be happy to give you more information.

May the year to come be one in which you find ways to recognize the resources that God has entrusted to you and discover new ways those resources can be a way for you to give a gift of compassion and caring beyond the traditional "gift-giving" season into the entire year.


A Special Invitation...



Sanctuary Upgrades Coming in January

Worship is at the heart of who we are and who we are called to be in the world. Making worship accessible to people of all abilities is incredibly important to us. To better support that goal, we are upgrading both our projection system and our audio system in the sanctuary. These improvements will make projected information clearer and brighter and ensure that worship is heard more consistently and reliably, both in the sanctuary and online. While our current system may still function, we have experienced increasing glitches with older equipment that affect how worship is seen and heard.

Because of your incredible generosity to the building fund, we are able to move forward with this important project. An anonymous donor has pledged \$20,000 toward the upgrades, contingent upon that same amount being given by others throughout the congregation. Offering Envelopes for 2026


If you've used offering envelopes previously, your new envelopes are available on the table in the Upper Narthex. The 2026 envelope packs are in alphabetical order by last name.



IMPORTANT: Note that your offering envelope number has changed, so it is important that you do not use the new offering envelopes before January 1st, 2026.

If you are doing all of your giving in 2026 through Pushpay (highly recommended!), you will not need offering envelopes.
