### From Pastor Jen...

Dear Trinity Family,

**A**s we prepare to enter the most holy of weeks in the life of the church, I invite you to take a deep breath and pause, just for a moment. Take a moment to think about the big picture: the world and its leaders, your life-long faith journey, the presence of Trinity in this community, nations at war, and any other big things that in little (or big) ways impact your daily life.

As we enter Holy Week together, in what ways do the story of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection help meet you where you are right now? How does remembering his struggles with religious and secular leaders, his speaking truth to power, his examples of humility in washing feet and breaking bread, and his death on the cross open up new ways for you to live in the world today?

For me, especially this year, it will provide moments of comfort and moments of hope. Moments of comfort as I am reminded of all the earthly trials, struggles, pain, worries, feelings, and human experiences that Jesus encountered.

Yes, that provides comfort that anything I experience and feel, God has experienced it too, in human flesh and blood. It gives me comfort to know that God has felt all of this, and knows these experiences intimately. I hope if comfort is what you need right now that you experience it this Holy Week.

And, if hope is what you need, then there will be signs of that, too. Not just in the celebration and joy at the empty tomb, but leading up to that celebration as well. There is hope in five young people celebrating their first Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday as they show us that there is a place for them, and for you, at the Lord's Table. There is hope as we hear Jesus' passion story on Good Friday through the voices of many different

*From Pastor Eileen...*

*Wounds, Scars, and Resurrection*

My dear siblings in Christ,

**A**s we come to Holy Week we are preparing to remember the crucifixion and the resurrection of Jesus. It can be much too easy to relegate this remembrance to a past event.

But the reality is that Jesus continues to be persecuted and tortured and inflicted with scars over and over again. “*Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison and did not take care of you? 45 Then he will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.’*” (Matthew 25:44-45)

When we fail to care for the most vulnerable in our midst or when we remain silent in the face of unjust persecution, we are participating in the suffering of Jesus.

There are loud voices in our midst that proclaim that there are some people more deserving than others. Voices that deny that adequate food, safe shelter, meaningful work and health care are the rights of all human beings. Voices that have the audacity to claim that they are “Christian.”

But we know that they are not followers of Jesus. In fact, Jesus had a word for people who claim to be pious, religious people but who actually are primarily centered on their own comforts and privileges: “hypocrites.”

We begin our worship each sabbath with confession. Because we know we fall short and we know we are always in need of God’s mercy and forgiveness. With humility and deep gratitude we receive the reminder that we are forgiven, and we ask for the Holy Spirit’s work to continue to shape us into the people God created us to be.

As we come to this Holy Week, I pray that you will make it a priority to worship, whether in person or with your online presence, to be reminded of Jesus’ call for us to be servants to one another on Maundy Thursday, to remember the suffering and death Jesus willingly accepted on Good Friday, and to celebrate with joy the reminder that Christ is risen, and that life is God’s gift and desire for all people.

Together, as true followers of Jesus and people of the resurrection, we can work to be the bearers of God’s Spirit to bring healing into our suffering world.

*Pastor Jen’s New Favorite: A Daily Devotional Resource*

It is a daily devotion written for youth and adults that follows a five-step format—Pause, Listen, Think, Pray, Go. It is accessible through their website [d365.org](http://d365.org) where you can find the daily devotional each day and sign up for email or text reminders. You can also download the app for easy access on the go. It is a resource supported by multiple church bodies, including the ELCA. Please check out this resource. Pastor Jen went to seminary with one of the contributors and will be meeting up with him to share feedback after Easter. Once you try it, let Pastor Jen know what you think! ▲

## From Vicar April...

**(Vicar) April showers** bring May flowers! Spring has finally arrived, and with it comes the closing of the Lenten season and the beginning of Holy Week. This is my favorite week of the church year. So much is happening here at Trinity—from Easter egg hunts and First Holy Communion classes to Palm Sunday and the long Gospel readings—all leading us toward this final week and the pivotal moment of our faith: the Resurrection.

Each year I find myself reflecting on what the Resurrection means to me and how my journey through Lent has shaped me differently than in years past. This year, being at Trinity has left a lasting impression as I walked through the season—from Ash Wednesday to the cross of Good Friday, and now toward the joy of Easter morning. I pray that Lent has been as meaningful and transformative for you as it has been for me.

One of the Gospel passages I look forward to reading every Easter comes from the Gospel of John, when Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene. It is only when Jesus says her name—“*Mary*” (John 20:16)—that she finally recognizes him. He calls her by name.

“April” is what I want to hear Jesus say. I want to hear him call me by name, and I wonder if I would recognize his voice as Mary did. In a time when there is much uncertainty and turmoil in the world, the promise that Jesus knows us and calls us by name brings great joy and hope. I pray that this promise brings the same comfort and hope to you.

During Lent, the “Holy Thief” invited us to let go—perhaps of burdens, worries, or things we were holding too tightly—and place them into God’s hands. For me, it was a reminder to “let go and let God” handle the things I cannot control, allowing my spirit to rest in the loving hands of my Creator. Perhaps this is a practice worth continuing for another forty days.

I would love to hear about your Lenten journey this year. What were you able to let go of—or perhaps what was harder to release? What helped strengthen your spiritual practices? If you see me around Trinity, please stop and share your story. I would be grateful to hear these little spiritual nuggets that I can take with me from here.




### Faith Night at the Reading Fightin' Phils—June 19<sup>th</sup>

### *Lutheran Day in the Capitol—April 20<sup>th</sup>*

Each spring, Lutherans from across Pennsylvania gather in Harrisburg for Lutheran Day in the Capitol, an annual event sponsored by LAMPa—Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania. This year's event takes place on Monday, April 20<sup>th</sup>, and Trinity Lutheran is encouraged to be represented!

LAMPa is the ELCA's public policy voice in Pennsylvania, working on issues ranging from hunger and housing to human rights and creation care. Lutheran Day brings together advocates from all seven Pennsylvania synods for a day of workshops, worship, and face-to-face meetings with state legislators—putting our faith into action in the public square.

The day typically begins with breakfast and educational sessions in the morning, followed by visits to the Capitol to meet with your own elected representatives in the afternoon. No prior advocacy experience is needed—LAMPa provides training and preparation for legislative visits.


